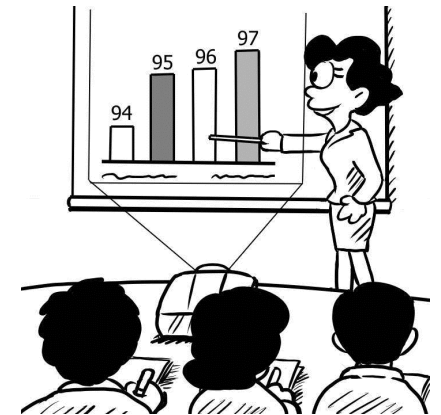

The charming wooden toy, known as a Russian nesting doll or matryoshka doll, is one of Russia's most recognizable symbols. The practice of making these nesting dolls is not as long-standing as one might think. In fact, matryoshka dolls emerged in Russia in the 1890s. The first nesting doll was carved by a toy maker called Vasily Zvyozdochkin, who may have been inspired by a Japanese doll that his boss's wife had acquired on her travels. It was Sergey Malyutin, the artist who painted the dolls, who gave them their distinctive Russian look. He painted the largest doll to look like a Russian peasant woman, and the seven figures inside her like members of her family—five little girls, a little boy, and a baby. The makers called the toy matryoshka, meaning "little mother." (Unit 12)
